Letter from Holy Redeemer School

Parents, teachers and the administration of Holy Redeemer Primary School in Belize City are on high alert after the school reported that one of the children

attending the institution tested positive for meningitis.

In a note to parents, the lower division principal writes in a letter dated January 31,

that, "The administration was informed this morning that a student of Infant 1 Nicasio tested positive for Meningitis." The letter continues, "The student was present at school on Monday, January 29, 2024 (morning session). Therefore the class of Infant 1 Nicasio was asked to remain at home today as a means of precaution."

While the school says that the child tested positive for Meningitis, a release from the Ministry of Health states otherwise. It says that it is investigating a potential case of meningitis. A late release on Wednesday, January 31 states that "The Ministry of Health & Wellness, through its surveillance system, was alerted to a potential case of meningitis in a six-yearold resident of Belize City. Preliminary laboratory results suggest that it is not bacterial meningitis, and that the child is currently in good health.

In response, the ministry is carrying out an investigation, conducting further tests and implementing recommended measures in schools and among individuals who had contact with the child. The Central Health Region team is leading the implementation of the preventive measures."

Meningitis is a bacterial or viral infection that causes swelling of the protective membrane of the

brain and spinal cord it can cause death. On December 8, 9-year-old Jayce Brown a student of United Evergreen Primary School in Belmopan died from the disease after being admitted to hospital for 3 days.

Another Briceno Drug Plane Scandal?

Another Briceno is caught up in scandal for Belize's involvement in alleged narcotics trafficking. This time it is the Prime Minister of Belize who is under the microscope for the sale of a plane that was approved and ended up back under the control of drug cartels.

The plane is a Gulfstream G2 Jet that was seized by Belizean authorities in February of 2020 and shot down over Venezuelan airspace on January 25, 2024. Belizeans are very familiar with the aircraft because it was captured near the Coastal Highway with over 70 bales of cocaine, the largest bust in Belize's history. The plane was pretty much intact and flight ready.

Shortly after being elected the government, the Briceno administration moved to sell planes that were seized by law enforcement during the Barrow administration. This move raised eyebrows locally and internationally because of the likelihood that the very cartels would orchestrate a way to regain control of the valuable aircraft. Despite criticisms, Briceno approved the sales.

What makes the sale even more suspicious is that it never went to open auction. And according to credible sources, at least one interested buyer was offering more than what the planes were sold for. Three planes were sold to a Mexican from the Conzumel area. The Gulfstream G2 Jet that is now making news left Belize only eleven (11) days before it was shot down by Venezuelan authorities.

According to Venezuelan officials, the unauthorized flight originated from Mexico and is believed to have been transporting drugs and other illicit cargo.

The United Democratic Party is now calling for a Commission of Inquiry into the sale of the planes. In a release the party states, "This matter requires urgent and serious attention as the country's very reputation is at stake. Our international allies, who had already objected to the sale of confiscated narco planes by this administration are now concerned that high ranking officials in government were instrumental in the return of a seized aircraft to the cartel.

"A Commission of Inquiry must be convened to answer important questions of national security concern. Why did government opted to sell the aircraft rather than add it to our military's air wing? What

was the process used to sell the aircraft? Who were the interested buyers? What were the offers for the plane? Who purchased the aircraft? What background search

was conducted on interested buyers and source of funds?"

Prime Minister Briceno has not comment on the issue as yet, a full week later.

Woman was Stabbed to Death

Police are no closer to solving the murder of 30-year-old Margaret Cleland whose body was found on the side of a road in the village of willows bank on Tuesday, January 19. They had originally detained Cleland's husband but he has since been released without charges. As the investigations proceed however, police have concluded that Cleland had died as a result of being stabbed multiple times. A post mortem result confirmed that

she had bled to death.

Cleland's common-law husband had reported to police that he had arrived at home on the day of the murder to find blood in various locations in and out of the house. He told police that he had found his toddler son in a pool of water in the yard. Nearby there were various places where blood could be seen. He elicited the help of neighbors and later found his wife on the side of the road not far from her home.

Baby Chokes To Death On Pill

A routine administration of a de-worming pill to a toddler caused the baby's death. Health and police authorities are investigating the circumstances under which 1 year old Shawn Armstrong III died after being given a pill. The child's father, Shawn Armstrong II, told media outlets that on Friday, January 22 he helped his girlfriend, Sarina Welcome, to give a de-worming pill to his son. He says that he held the baby while the mother crushed a piece of the pill and gave it to the toddler. Thereafter he gave the baby some water and it was within seconds that the baby began to choke.

In the ensuing moments the baby could not breathe and the frantic parents sought help from neighbors. All efforts to help the baby at the young couple's Camalote home proved unsuccessful and this led to Armstrong to jump onto an old motorcycle he had in his yard and rushed the baby to the Western Regional Hospital in Belmopan. While there were efforts to save the baby they were unsuccessful and he died.

The couple says that the baby was given the pill on the recommendation of a nurse at the Belmopan hospital, however they were not told how to administer the medication. The child had been take to the hospital where he was given to injections, presumably vaccines, since the baby had not been taken to a health clinic for some time. There is now an ongoing investigation to determine the baby's cause of death.

Teresita Torres, the main organizer of one of the oldest and largest agriculture and cultural events in the northern part of the country, the Chan Pine Ridge Agriculture and Culture Fair, is complaining that she is being denied permission to hold the event.

Torres reached out to the Guardian Newspaper to say that she wrote the chairman of the village, Cornelio Torres on January 11 to invite him to a meeting called by the villagers who wanted to inquire about the fair's status. According to Torres, the chairman snubbed the meeting and she subsequently wrote him again to say that the villagers were intent on proceeding with the fair and simply asked him for permission. One day later on the 14th of January, Torres was met with a cold 'NO'.

In a letter from Cornelio Torres to Teresita Torres, the Chairman states, "The council has taken into account several factors that influence our decision, including pre-scheduled maintenance work of the village's public spaces, concerns regarding the safety and welfare of our community, and other logistical issues that are currently beyond our capacity to address in time for the proposed dates.

We understand the importance of the 9th March Fiesta to our village an certainly do not wish to diminish its significance. However, it is incumbent upon us as village leaders to make decisions to prioritize the community's longterm inters and well being..."

UDP Chairman Tells Senate To Follow Standing Orders



Senate has no Minister to represent Government

UDP Party Chairman, and lead Senator Hon. Michael Peyrefitte has written to the president of Senate to once again highlight that the Government cannot proceed with meetings of the Senate without having a minister represent the Government's positions.

Hon. Peyrefitte explained to the media during a virtual meeting that when Eamon Courtenay resigned as a minister of Government, the PUP administration was left without ministerial representation in the Senate. With that, Peyrefitte contends that it is impossible to move certain bills through the Senate. Government Business, Public Business and Money Business need to be presented by

a minister stated Peyrefitte.

There is a Senate meeting scheduled for February 8 and Hon. Peyrefitte says he will bring it up publicly during the meeting. In nothing is done to remedy the situation, Hon. Peyrefitte says that the UDP reserves its rights. While there are criticisms that in the past leaders of Government Business in the Senate have not been ministers, Peyrefitte says that bad precedent does not make good law. "We are here now and certain things cannot move without a Minister," stated Peyrefitte. As for the state where the Government finds itself in, Hon. Peyrefitte says that it was as a result of hasty decisions by the Government that left us where we are.

Vegetables More Expensive Than Ever!

Based on figures released by the Statistical Institute of Belize, the price of fruits and vegetables are at their most expensive. According to the institute, there has been an across the board increase by double figures in the cost of every single fruit and vegetable which they track the price for. Among the highest prices are limes which went up in price by 31.2% over last years price. Green corn has gone up by a massive 39.4% while sweet potatoes saw an increase of 42.3%. The price of cassava has gone up by a huge 55.3% while plantains hit a 68.3% increase over the same period last year.

The price of cheese, natural milk and evaporated milk are not lagging behind with increases of 17.7%, 21.5% and 33% respectively

With these kinds of increases, where cheese now sells at \$15.38 per pound it is a wonder what exactly comprises the diet of Belizeans these days. And of course, there is nothing being done to address the situation. The Government had announced that there would be more monitoring for price gouging but that was just a flash in the pan with not very much respite being given to the Belizean consumers.

Pup Bridge-Politics Puts Lives at Risk

In a strategic political move leading up to the March 6th municipal elections, the People's Unity Party (PUP) has unveiled plans to open the incomplete \$30 million Haulover Bridge on February 1, 2024. The bridge replacement project was initiated by the previous United Democratic Party (UDP) administration but construction did not begin until late in 2021. The construction faced delays as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Originally slated for completion in December of the previous year, the ongoing project is now a scaled-down version of the UDP's original design, which was more elaborate, aesthetically pleasing, and as such would have cost more. The bridge won't be fully completed and operational until mid-March, missing the

opportunity for the PUP to capitalize on its completion in the upcoming elections.

A release from the Ministry acknowledges that the project is not entirely complete, citing the necessity of the temporary opening to finalize the tie-in of the new alignment to the Philip Goldson Highway and facilitate upgrades to underground public utility infrastructure. However, there are concerns about the practicality of opening the bridge before completing these essential works. It doesn't make sense because opening up the bridge ahead of the completion of the above-mentioned works won't aid in their completion; instead, it will slow down progress, putting both users and the construction team at risk of injury and in conflict with each other.



As far back as October of 2017 the United Democratic Party Government announced and got approval from the House of Representatives for financing for the construction of a new bridge to replace the existing Haulover Bridge. At the time Hon. Dean Barrow announced that the Government had secured a 12 million U.S. dollar loan from the OPEC Fund for International Development (OFID). The loan was to bear an interest rate of 2.5% per annum over a period of 20 years with 5 years grace period.

As fate would have it the construction on the bridge did not commence until the middle of January, 2022. The space of time between the securing of the loan and the implementation was as a result of many factors including the length of time it took to design the bridge, and ultimately the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic which slowed down, delayed and

postponed the implementation of a number of infrastructural projects across the country. Nonetheless, with financing already secured all that was needed was for the contractors to be identified and work in earnest commenced in 2022.

Fast forward two years later and the UDP Haulover bridge, albeit significantly scaled down by the PUP Government, is nearing completion. This week, after the contractor responsible for the construction of the bridge itself, M&M Engineering, gave the go ahead, the paving of the approaches to the bridge commenced. This is being done by Teichrob and Sons construction company and features hotmix paving which will ensure longevity of service.

The bridge is the longest spanning in the country and will replace one of the oldest existing bridges in the country.
